What we do at practical level ? Advocacy initiatives, joint projects, think tank activity, conferences and seminars, capacity building actions... and much more more !



A BIT OF HISTORY OF THE CPMR




- Think tank, Lobby & platform for cooperation



<u>CPMR Maritime Agenda 2018</u>

The CPMR <u>maritime agenda</u> describes the actions that it will carry out at European level and in the sea basins through its Geographical Commissions.

The CPMR strongly contributed to the creation of the European Integrated Maritime Policy (IMP) established in 2007. Since then, the CPMR has been supporting efforts to strengthen the governance of the IMP and the "blue growth" approach.




A regular partner of EU institutions, CPMR is a member of several expert groups of the European Commission and has observer status within the International oil Compensation Fund (IOPC).

The CPMR also runs the Secretariat of the European Parliament Intergroup on Seas, Rivers, Islands and Coastal Areas (SEARICA), renewed in 2014.











Maritime dimension in RIS 3













Project report 2018 available on our web <u>site</u>

- 17 running projects, co-funded by the EU that involve the CPMR IMC on: blue growth, biodiversity protection, energy, sustainable tourism, maritime spatial planning, sustainable mobility, mediterranean diet, water, territorial integrated development, governance...
- ***** More than 35 M euros budget for the partners over the period 2017-2022
- 6 projects under evaluation
- New projects being set-up
- 11 projets recently concluded being capitalized (2010-2016)

Potential links & synergies with BLUEMED (I.) bluemed

- Contribute to and enhance the understanding of the SRIA in the regions (and by territorial stakeholders). Disseminate information to the regions to improve the understanding and support the future implementation on the ground
- Link with the actions, initiatives and projects (e.g. Interreg MED funded) where the CPMR, its IMC and the member regions are directly involved: analysis, studies, pilots can contribute to the SRIA
- Synergies in different cooperation frameworks at EU/basin scale: EUSAIR, WESTMED, UfM Works on Blue Economy, Future of territorial cooperation at Mediterranean scale
- Set of topics that could be especially interesting for synergies
- Exchanges during IMC/Project & BlueMed meetings (e.g. Naples, Athens, Cartagena 2018, Patras 2018, Barcelona 2018 others...)





Potential links & synergies with BLUEMED (II.) Potential topics for synergies:

- Marine Energies: e.g synergies with InnoBlueGrowth, Maestrale, Pelagos
- Professional yachting: e.g. synergies with InnoBlueGrowth, IBLUE
- Sustainable Maritime & Coastal Tourism: indicators, decision support systems and planning tools, heritage, open data applied to sustainable mass tourism, cruise tourism e.g. synergis with the CPMR IMC works on Sustainable tourism & culture/IMC Political agenda on ST in the MED, BleuTourMed, <u>Mitomed+</u>, <u>Co-Evolve</u> from Interreg MED, Med Coast for Blue Growth UfM labelled project etc.
- ICZM-MSP in relation with coastal erosion, geohazards, marine data: e.g. Bologna Charter/Joint Action Plan, SIMWESTMED project, potential synergies with MERCATOR/Copernicus? Inputs of past projects to capitalize...





Potential links & synergies with BLUEMED (III.) Potential topics for synergies:

- ICZM & MSP in relation Biodiversity protection/MPAs: e.g. PANACeA and the modulars it capitalizes, inputs from past projects to capitalize.
- CPMR work on maritime investments and smart specialisation strategies, RIS3
- Blue Skills in different maritime sectors: e.g. synergies with CPMR Vasco da Gama initiative, Summer School with University of Bari (2018) on green transports and logistics, others.
- Others topics such as circular economy, living marine ressources, biobluetechs, marine litter, marine surveillance: CPMR work on fisheries & aquaculture, marine litter, PANACeA and several modulars, InnoBlueGrowth and Proteus





Potential links & synergies with BLUEMED (IV.)

- Co-funder » and « Implementer » role of CPMR IMC and its Regions e.g. INTERREG programmes, H2020, Life, EC DG EASME/MARE calls on blue growth/economy, ROPs/ERDF...
- Support the matching between territorial needs, BLUEMED SRIA/Implementation plan & funding opportunities: alignment of programs priorities and instruments
- Share ideas for pilots/projects implementing the BLUEMED SRIA : concrete long term partnerships/actions
