

UfM Ministerial on Blue Economy



It recognized the importance of the blue economy for the Mediterranean region, and settles the existing long-term objectives for sustainable management of the sea and for a cleaner Mediterranean, acknowledging the need to invest on Blue research, technology, innovation, knowledge and skills.

UfM Working Group on Blue Economy

The **UfM Working Group on Blue Economy** is a technical group composed of representatives designated by the UfM countries and is co-chaired by the two co-Presidencies with the support of the UfM Secretariat.

Meets once a year and focuses its efforts on the **implementation of the Ministerial Declaration on Blue Economy** of November 2015.

Aims at:

- Further shaping the regional Blue Economy agenda and portfolio based on the Ministerial recommendations
- Exchanging information, views and best practices between countries as well as stakeholders
- Creating synergies among initiatives
- Providing input to future actions and possible sea basin approaches/maritime strategies, without duplicating existing initiatives and bodies

WestMed Initative

In the <u>UfM Regional Stakeholder Conference on the Blue Economy</u>, Naples, 29 November 2017 it was launched the <u>Initiative for the sustainable development</u> of the blue economy in the western Mediterranean (WestMed)

- It received the support of the ministers of Algeria, France, Italy, Libya, Malta,
 Mauritania, Morocco, Portugal, Spain and Tunisia
- The conference gathered more than 400 stakeholders dealing with marine and maritime issues from the entire Mediterranean region
- It was launched Virtual Knowledge Centre on the Blue Economy, the webbased information and networking platform for Blue Economy stakeholders in the Mediterranean

- PLASTIC-BUSTERS for a Mediterranean free from litter

PLASTIC-BUSTERS for a Mediterranean free from litter

- **Promoters**: University of Siena
- **Beneficiaries**: National and local water authorities and public and private actors involved in the water sector
- **Budget**: 8.810.000€
- **Aim**: The overall goal of the project is to effectively tackle the issue of marine litter in the Mediterranean and thus contribute to the de-pollution of the Mediterranean sea
- **Labelisation**: The UfM labeled this project in 2016 and it has contributed by mediating with international financial institutions to rise funds for its implementation



MedCoast4BG - Med Coasts for Blue Growth

- Promoters: CPMR Intermediterranean Commission
- **Beneficiaries**: Public administrations, national/regional/local private operators, citizens of coastal areas across the Mediterranean, research institutions/universities, International Organizations & networks.
- **Budget**: 3.085.000€
- Aim: MedCoast4BG's general objective is to analyse and promote the co-evolution of human activities and natural systems in coastal areas particularly or potentially devoted to tourism, taking into consideration climate change effects, sustainable development of tourist activities, and basing its analysis and actions on the principles of Integrated Coastal Zone Management (ICZM) and Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP).
- Labelisation: 2017

BlueMed & PRIMA

According to the 2018 PRIMA Work Plan:

 Marine research is not included in the scope of PRIMA as it is in BlueMed, but PRIMA will look for synergies and complementarities, particularly in aspects related to land-based aquaculture and sea-based food processing.



Research & Innovation

Valletta Declaration (2017)



The Valletta Declaration on Strengthening Euro-Mediterranean Cooperation through Research and Innovation (May 2017) welcomes the BLUEMED initiative as a means to promote a healthy, productive and resilient Mediterranean Sea and stress the importance of structuring Euro-Mediterranean cooperation in marine and maritime sectors to encompass a broad range of objectives comprising the creation of new, blue jobs and social well-being while also being mindful of sustainable development and the preservation of the environment in the Mediterranean area.

- By supporting the Euro-Mediterranean community of stakeholders of the Blue Economy through Higher Education and Research, it will **enhance the shared knowledge of the Mediterranean basin in marine and maritime sectors**.
