Every summer, since 1986, we've sailed along Italian coasts and in other mediterranean seas,, monitoring land-based pollution like sewage waters or litter.

BEACH LITTER SURVEY

250 monitored beaches (Italy and other Med countries) 400 clean-ups every year


LAKE LITTER SURVEY




Microplastic particles were found in each sampling area and in all the samples.

We found high values of plastic litter density even in the areas located far from the inland input zones, with the lowest human density and the lack of industrial activities as islands are.

even freshwaters are not immune to this problem

The influence of the wastewater treatment plants on the increasing of the presence of microplastics is undeniable.

Microplastic pollution should be considered as indicator in the establishing of the **Good Status Quality** of the freshwater (European Directive 2000/60)



Legambiente and the citizen science



Our international campaign *Clean Up the Med* involve thousands of volunteers from several Med Countries in **cleaning** and **monitoring beach litter**.

In 2018 litter was monitored in **80 Italian beaches** and in **135 med ones** by the same scientific protocol

(UNEP, 2015)






BANS: plastic bags, since 2013

THE PROJECT

The overall aim of the Clean Sea LIFE project, **financed under the LIFE Programme**, is to support the application of the Marine Strategy Framework Directive (MSFD) and EU biodiversity policy relating to marine litter.



The specific objectives are:

- To increase awareness of marine litter, empowering citizens to become part of the solution;
- To remove existing litter, including lost fishing gear, and prevent further littering;
- To **promote** "fishing for litter" initiatives and to train fishing industry professionals in responsible practices
- To provide guidelines for the management of marine litter, increase exchange of knowledge and the uptake of best practices and assist authorities in achieving a Good Environmental Status of the sea, as required under the Marine Strategy Framework Directive.


